

Mansfeld Magnet Middle School Site Council Minutes April 3, 2025

C. Davidson called the meeting to order at 4:34 pm in the Conference Room.

I. Call to the Audience:

 C. Mosconi and Dot Kret talked about "Nathan's Kids", the fund that was established in honor of Ms. Kret's deceased son, Nathan Lex, a MathCats tutor that worked with Mansfeld kids. The fund has close to \$9,000 currently. Ms. Kret would like to see it continue as a sustaining gift. It was discussed that designated tax credit funds can be used for extracurricular supplies, paying people, etc. We talked that it may be better to funnel these donations into PTSO so that the money would be more accessible for needs that arise. C. Mosconi mentioned that they wanted input about how funds could be used. Some suggestions were purchasing a set of math manipulatives/white boards for tutors to use, paying stipends to tutors, providing food boxes.
