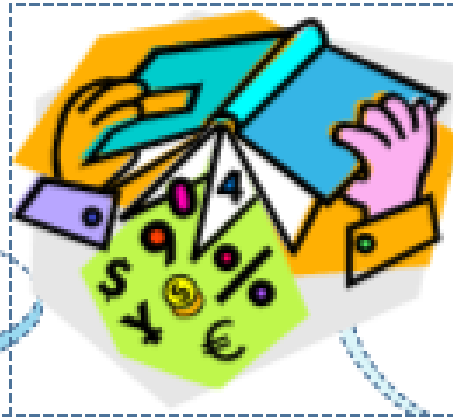
- Build a relationship with the students in all classes.
