



**Mansfield Magnet Middle School
Site Council Minutes
January 15, 2026**

C. Davidson called the meeting to order at 4:33 pm in the Conference Room.

Members Present: Catherine Davidson (Facilitator), Karla Martinez (Principal), Anna Elizondo (6th grade), Nicole Roldan (Community), Kirsta Mosconi (certified, non-classroom), Micah Francis (Student- Student Council), Jesus Diaz (parent)

I. Call to the Audience:

- C. Mosconi asked if the Site Council/PTSO was put on the marquee. C Davidson said that it was added. K. Martinez will add it as a permanent section of the ParentSquare bulletin each week.

II. Reports

Approval of the Minutes- N. Roldan motioned to approve Dec.4 minutes. M. Francis seconded the motion. The minutes were approved unanimously.

Principal's Report (K. Martinez):

- Current Enrollment- 694. Enrollment is open for more students currently.
 - 6th Grade: 190
 - 7th Grade: 247
 - 8th Grade: 257
- Highlights/Happenings
 - December Events-Choir & Band & Orchestra Winter Concerts were wonderful and standing room only.
 - Kicked off Quarter 3 with our Bulldog Belief Assemblies. Student Council did a great job in organizing and trying new ways to engage our kids.
 - Homework Helper has resumed, and we have started our clubs-Chess, Fitness, Craft Café, D & D (2), Life Skills, eSports, Bulldog Dialogue. Coach Campillo has also started as a volunteer sponsor of the volleyball club. We will be monitoring attendance. We hope to have more club offerings next year.
 - Athletics- Quarter 3 sports are Boys and Girls Soccer. First game is next week on Thursday at CE Rose.
 - The Sprouts House began planning with our two teachers, Ms. Smith and Ms. Trowbridge, as to what class time may look like at Sprouts House.
- Hiring Updates

- We have hired for our 8-hour custodian that will be assigned to our navigator and 6th grade hall.
- We have hired for our 4-hour grounds position. Upcoming Events

- Undesignated Tax Credit balance is \$28,842.89.

III. Discussion/Action

- Tax Credit Balances
 - C. Davidson received a full list of all tax credit balances but it is still unclear about the specific balance of the Nathan's Kids fund. C. Mosconi and C Davidson will discuss.
- Uniform Policy- Proposed Changes (from the last meeting)-
 - Suggested changes were shared with the team leads as a PowerPoint to share with teams and get feedback. The feedback was as follows:
 - Top Garments
 - 6th- wanted only one day a week for Mansfeld shirts
 - 7th- did not have any strong opinions
 - 8th- ok with grey/black. They did not agree with regulating the length/fit due to gov board restrictions. They did not care about only having one day a week for the Mansfeld shirts
 - Navigators- concerned that students might try to wear unofficial shirts if we allowed every day for Mansfeld shirts
 - Students- liked the idea of Mansfeld shirts, liked adding grey to polos. Concerned about kids wearing them every day, not just one day a week
 - Certified Non-Classroom (CNC)- want Mansfeld shirts allowed all days or no days. Loved the black and grey allowance. Do not want to regulate the length, in accordance with board policy.
 - Bottom Garments
 - 6th- did not want to allow shorts that were frayed/cut-off
 - 7th- no objections to proposed policy
 - 8th- no objections to proposed policy
 - Navigators- agreed with policy as proposed
 - Students- agreed with all changes
 - CNC- did not want to regulate the length, in accordance with board policy
 - Shoes
 - 6th- were concerned about safety regarding allowing crocs
 - 7th- no objections to proposed policy
 - 8th- no objections to proposed policy
 - Navigators- did not care about allowing croc-style shoes, PE wanted to make sure they could restrict shoes during their classes
 - Stu Council- like idea of adding croc-style shoes
 - CNC- loved adding croc-style shoes
 - Outer garments
 - 6th- were ok with grey/black and liked the logo size restriction
 - 7th- were ok with grey/black and did not want to restrict size of logos to 3"x3", as long as majority of the short

- 8th- does not care about size of logos
- Navigators- liked the size restriction of the logo on front and back
- Stu Council- like adding black/grey hoodies
- CNC- did not agree with limiting logo size
- Hats and Accessories
 - Navigators- were concerned about bandanas, did not want anything worn in classrooms
 - Stu Council- agreed with hats/accessories changes
 - 6th- asked about leashes, did not like hoods up allowed in classes
 - 7th- no objections to proposed policy
 - 8th- no objections to proposed policy
 - CNC- no objections to any changes
- C. Davidson reviewed current TUSD Gov Board policies and looked at Dodge's most recent uniform policy. Council discussed current issues we have had with free dress days regarding violations. C. Davidson proposed that we change the verbiage of the length policy to say 'pants, capris, shorts, skorts, dresses, and skirts must be longer than fingertips at side' instead of 'appropriately fitted'. Discussion moved on to the logos on outer garments. N. Roldan made a motion to vote on restricting logo size to 3"x 3". A. Elizondo seconded the motion. Motion did not pass with 2 yay votes, 4 no votes, not abstentions. J. Diaz motioned to approve the dress code with the changes as discussed. N Roldan seconded the motion. Motion was approved unanimously.
